In your correspondence, you reference the State of Hawaii Board of Education Policy 101-13 and

Both the policy and regulation allow for classroom discussions of matters which generate opposing viewpoints and are not intended to suppress spontaneous student discussion during approved lesson plans. The Hawaii State Department of Education annually provides guidance to its employees on how to plan for a classroom discussion of difficult, emotionally charged or controversial issues and also how to manage a situation where a student spontaneously raises a controversial subject.
