RE: FOIA Request Regarding the acts, list of positions, names, and emails in the UNRWA (United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East).

Dear FOIA Officer:

This letter is a request (“Request”) in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act (“FOIA”), 5 U.S.C. § 552, and the corresponding department/agency implementing regulations. The Request is made by the American Center for Law and Justice (“ACLJ”) on behalf of its members.

The ACLJ is a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to the defense of constitutional liberties secured by law. The ACLJ regularly monitors governmental activity and works to inform the public of such affairs. The ACLJ and its globally affiliated organizations are committed to ensuring governmental accountability and the ongoing viability of freedom and liberty in the United States and around the world.

To summarize, this Request seeks records pertaining to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA), and any employee of UNRWA involved in acts, membership, or financial support of Hamas in the attack of Israel on October 7, 2023.

Background

Pursuant to Central Intelligence Agency FOIA regulation 32 C.F.R. § 1900.12, this Background addresses “as specific as possible . . . the records . . . [the ACLJ is] . . . seeking by including, for example, the relevant date or date range, the title of the record, the type of record (such as memorandum or report), the specific event or action to which the record refers, and the subject matter” to the best of the ACLJ’s knowledge.

On January 26, 2024, the Biden Administration suspended support to UNRWA after the Israeli IDF reported that 12 members of UNRWA had directly participated in the terrorist attack on Israel on October 7, 2023. The report further showed that the Biden Administration was supporting UNRWA and Hamas with close to \$1 Billion since 2021. *National Review* states that:

Biden Administration has already transferred over 99 percent of congressionally budgeted funding to UNRWA. Only \$300,000 out of about \$121 million is being withheld — and that’s just for the time being. Note: That \$121 million is just a fraction of the \$1 billion that President Biden has plowed into UNRWA since 2021. The implication, of course, is that the American dollars that pay for jihadist atrocities will continue flowing once Biden figures the heat is off.

Over 1,100 people were killed in the October 7 sneak attacks carried out by Hamas with UNRWA complicity. Hundreds more were savagely wounded, raped, and/or taken hostage. (Andrew MacCarthy, *National Review*, (Jan. 31, 2024) *Designate UNRWA as a Terrorist Organization*).

The involvement of UNWRA with Hamas goes further. As described in the *Wall Street Journal*:

“Two officials familiar with the intelligence said the UNRWA employees considered to have ties with militant groups were deemed to be ‘operatives,’ indicating they took active part in the organization’s military or political framework. The report said 23% of UNRWA’s male employees had ties to Hamas, a higher percentage than the average of 15% for adult males in Gaza, indicating a higher politicization of the agency than the population at large.” To repeat that last stat: Men in Gaza who work for the UN are *more likely* to be involved with Hamas than those who don’t have jobs at the UN agency. [Emphasis in original.]” (Carrie Keeler-Lynn, *Wall Street Journal*, (Jan. 29, 2024) *Intelligence Reveals Details of U.N. Agency Staff’s Links to Oct. 7 Attack*).

While UNRWA’s Commissioner-general Philippe Lazzarini denies that Hamas controlled the humanitarian help and supplies his agency delivered to Gaza, it is reported that:

A Palestinian man reportedly told Israel Defense Forces in December that “Hamas has their hands on UNRWA administration workers, and it manages UNRWA. . . . From the day they [Hamas] rose to power they took control of everything.”

For months, U.N. agencies have denied claims that Hamas steals humanitarian aid. GOP lawmakers aren’t so sure — this month, they called on UNRWA’s commissioner-general Philippe Lazzarini to answer how “taxpayer dollars may have, through UNRWA failures, supported Hamas terrorists”:

Lazzarini said in December that “attacking and trying to discredit humanitarian organizations such as the United Nations Relief and Works Agency” — the agency that, it has now been revealed employed at least twelve terrorists — “is yet another

means of waging war.” (Haley Strack, National Review, (Jan. 26, 2024) *What about the UNRWA Humanitarian-Aid Trucks*).

Furthermore, the Israeli Defense Forces have uncovered Hamas tunnels underneath UNRWA Headquarters in Gaza. Grenades, explosives rifles were found. Electrical powerlines connect the tunnel to the headquarters. Hamas has used electricity from UNRWA hospitals in Gaza to power its tunnels. (Ronny Reyes, New York Post, (Feb.11, 2024) *Israel uncovers Hamas tunnels under UNRWA headquarters in Gaza, claims terrorists siphoned electricity from the site*).

This Request seeks information about the CIA’s knowledge of how UNRWA is involved in the acts of October 7, 2023, who inside UNRWA was involved, and their position, contacts, and records.

Records Requested

For purposes of this Request, the term “record” means “any information” that qualifies under 5 U.S.C. § 552(f), consistent with the holdings of *Competitive Enter. Inst. v. Office of Sci. & Tech. Policy*, 827 F.3d 145 (D.C. Cir. 2016).

All requests seek records which include but are not limited to, any record located on backup tapes, archives, any other recovery, backup, storage or retrieval system, CIA electronic mail or message accounts, non-CIA electronic mail or message accounts, personal electronic mail or message accounts, CIA servers, non-CIA servers, and personal servers, as well as any electronic mail or message carbon copied to agency account recipients, any electronic mail or message carbon copied to non-agency account recipients, any electronic mail or message forwarded to agency account recipients, any electronic mail or message forwarded to non-agency account recipients, and attachments to any electronic mail or message.

For purposes of this Request, the term “briefing” includes, but is not limited to, any in-person meeting, teleconference, electronic communication, or other means of gathering or communicating by which information was conveyed to one or more person(s).

For purposes of this Request, the term “CIA official” includes, but is not limited to, any person who is (1) employed by or on behalf of the CIA, any Mission of the United States, or any Delegation of the United States, in any capacity; (2) contracted for services by or on behalf of the CIA, any Mission of the United States, or any Delegation of the United States, in any capacity; (3) appointed by the President of the United States to serve in any capacity at or within the CIA, any Mission of the United States, or any Delegation of the United States; or (4) any such person’s staff, agent or employee; all without regard to the component, bureau, or office in which that person serves.

For purposes of this Request, all sources, documents, letters, reports, briefings, articles, and press releases cited in this Request are incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

For purposes of this Request, any individual or entity’s name includes any alias or pseudonym.

For purposes of this Request, and unless otherwise indicated, the timeframe of records requested herein is Oct. 5, 2023, to the date this request is processed.

Pursuant to FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552 *et seq.*, ACLJ hereby requests that the CIA produce the following:

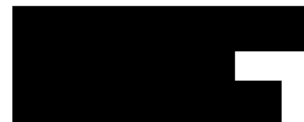
- 1. All records received from UNRWA sent to CIA Headquarters or to the field office responsible for Gaza.**
- 2. All records (translated) of Gazan or Hamas newspapers, magazines or public broadcasts via radio, TV, and cable.**
- 3. All records about Philippe Lazzarini, Commissioner-General of UNRWA.**
- 4. All records in the possession of the Departments responsible for Near Eastern and Terrorism intelligence analysis containing the words: “UNRWA” and “Hamas” or “Palestinian Islamic Jihad.”**
- 5. All records in the possession of the CIA office responsible for Gaza containing the words: “UNRWA” and “tunnel” or “tunnels.”**

CONCLUSION

If this Request is denied in whole or in part, the ACLJ requests that, within the time requirements imposed by FOIA, you support all denials by reference to specific FOIA exemptions and provide any judicially required explanatory information, including but not limited to, a *Vaughn* Index.


