RE: FOIA Request to U.S. Department of Homeland Security Citizenship & Immigration Services (USCIS) for Records regarding Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) database.

Dear FOIA Officer:

This letter is a request ("Request") in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552 *et seq.*, and the corresponding department/agency implementing regulations. The Request is made by the American Center for Law and Justice ("ACLJ").¹

Background

Pursuant to DHS FOIA regulation 6 C.F.R. §5.3(b), this Background addresses "the date, title or name, author, recipient, and subject matter of the record[s]" requested, to the extent known.

Texas, Ohio, and Florida have all filed suits to try and stop the DHS and USCIS denying access to²³ the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) database created by the passage

of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA) of 1996.⁴ Also, Virginia has been sued in order to end its purge of its voter rolls.⁵

The IIRIRA allows states to access immigration records through the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to verify or determine the citizenship or immigration status of individuals within their jurisdiction for authorized purposes under the law.⁶

As, election integrity is an important issue of great importance to the American public and SAVE can be accessed under IIRIRA, the denial of access needs to end in order for states to fulfill their duty to conduct and free, fair, and accurate election.

Records Requested

For purposes of this Request, the term "record" is "any information" that qualifies under 5 U.S.C. § 552(f). The term "record" also includes, but is not limited to, all relevant information created, stored, received, or delivered in any electronic or digital format, e.g., electronic mail, instant messaging or Facebook Messenger, iMessage, text messages or any other means of communication, and any information generated, sent, received, reviewed, stored or located on a government *or private* account or server, consistent with the holdings of *Competitive Enter. Inst. v. Office of Sci. & Tech. Policy*, 827 F.3d 145 (D.C. Cir. 2016) (rejecting agency argument that emails on private email accounts were not under agency control, and holding, "If a department head can deprive the citizens of their right to know what his department is up to by the simple expedient of maintaining his departmental emails on an account in another domain, that purpose is hardly served.").

For purposes of this request, the term "executive assistant" (including a secretary or administrative assistant or however described) means that the position exists to increase the effectiveness of others by performing as many office support duties as possible, including serving as the principal clerical and administrative support position in the immediate organizational unit in or for which the persons assisted have responsibility, by carrying out and coordinating all the clerical and day-to-day administrative support activities typically required to accomplish the work of the organization.

When this Request names a person or an office, it includes any alias or pseudonym name and any electronic communication account any such official might use.

For purposes of this Request, and unless otherwise indicated, the timeframe of records requested herein is September 1, 2024, to the date this Request is processed.

Pursuant to FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552 *et seq.*, ACLJ hereby requests that the U.S. Department of Homeland Security produce the following:

- 1. Any records of Director of the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services Ur Mendoza Jaddou or her executive assistants containing:
 - a. "Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements/SAVE Program;" or "Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA);" or "Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS);" and,
 - b. "noncitizens;" or "alien(s)," or "citizenship," or "immigration status," or, "voter" or "voter fraud" or "voter rolls" or "voter registration," or "voting" or "Quiet Period Provision" or "maintenance" or "90 days."
- 2. Any records of Deputy Director Jennifer B. Higgens or her executive assistants containing:
 - a. "Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements/SAVE Program;" or "Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA);" or "Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS);" and,
 - b. "noncitizens;" or "alien(s)," or "citizenship," or "immigration status," or, "voter" or "voter fraud" or "voter rolls" or "voter registration," or "voting" or "Quiet Period Provision" or "maintenance" or "90 days."
- **3.** Any communications or records involving the Systematic Alien Verification and Entitlements/SAVE program with
 - a. The Florida Department of Children and Families Secretary Shevaun Harris or her executive assistants; or
 - b. The Texas Department of Health and Human Services Executive Commissioner Cecile Erwin Young or her executive assistants; or
 - c. The Ohio Department of Job and Family Services Director Matt Damschrodr or his executive assistants; or
 - d. The Virginia Department of Social Services Commissioner James Williams or his executive assistants; or
 - e. The New York Department of Social Services Commissioner Molly Wasco Park or her executive assistants.

Each request seeks records that include, but are not limited to, any record located on backup tapes, archives, any other recovery, backup, storage or retrieval system, DHS electronic mail or message accounts, non-DHS electronic mail or message accounts, personal electronic mail or message

accounts, DHS servers, non-DHS servers, and personal servers, as well as any electronic mail or message carbon copied to agency account recipients, any electronic mail or message carbon copied to non-agency account recipients, any electronic mail or message forwarded to agency account recipients, any electronic mail or message forwarded to non-agency account recipients, and attachments to any electronic mail or message.

Fees

If there are any fees for searching or copying these records, please inform the ACLJ if the cost will exceed \$100. However, the ACLJ respectfully requests a waiver of all fees because the disclosure of the requested information is in the public interest. If necessary, a fee quote can be sent to the email below.

CONCLUSION

If this request is denied in whole or in part, the ACLJ requests that, within the time requirements imposed by FOIA, you support all denials by reference to specific FOIA exemptions and provide any judicially required explanatory information, including but not limited to, a *Vaughn* Index.
